## **Durlston: further information**


## Do you want to leave a lasting reminder of what Durlston means to you or someone close to you?

The blocks will provide space for 48 characters / letters (including spaces) giving plenty of scope for creativity. The blocks will be laid as part of the Durlston Project, but in the interim, your words will be displayed at the Visitor Centre and on the website.

The Walk of Words will be a celebration of Durlston's unique, living heritage, and will be seen by future generations of visitors. Spaces are limited and will allocated on a strictly 'first come' basis.

Durlston is a real gem on the Dorset coast. Few places in Britain are richer in wildlife, while its geological interest makes it a key location on the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site.

Local stone merchant George Burt left a unique legacy of the Victorian age at Durlston with the Great Globe and Castle.

Millions of visitors have enjoyed the delights of Durlston since Dorset's first country park was established here in 1975.

Over 700 Friends of Durlston provide invaluable voluntary support to the Ranger team and every year sees visits from thousands of school children.

The area is carefully managed for 'conservation and public enjoyment' by a broad partnership led by Dorset County Council.

# **The Durlston Project:**

The acquisition of the Durlston Castle lease in 2003 provided the impetus to build on Durlston's existing strengths and create a truly world-class visitor facility and eastern Gateway to the Jurassic Coast.

The Castle will be transformed and restored to its rightful position as the natural hub of the area, while the current visitor centre will be developed as an exciting Learning and Family Activity Centre. Great care will be taken to ensure that the conservation of Durlston's superb natural heritage is enhanced.

There will also be wider benefits for visitors and volunteers through improved access, opportunities for involvement and community use for all ages.

In 2006, following three years of careful development, the Project was earmarked £3.27m by the Heritage Lottery Fund. This success, along with other major funding contributions from the South West of England Regional Development Agency and Dorset County Council means that a large proportion of the £5.85m total project cost should be met.

However, there is still nearly £1 million of 'matched funding' to find – or the major funding will be lost. Put another way – every £1 you give is, in effect, worth over £5 to the project. With your help, Friends of Durlston and the Jurassic Coast Trust are working hard to raise the required money.
